Bridleway No. 25	Begins on the Horseheath Road; proceeds north-east for 980 metres as a grass track between hedges, to the southern tip of Borley Wood. The bridleway then turns and runs north-north-east for a further 150 metres around the edge of the wood to Point A. At this point, the bridleway turns and runs due north-east across arable fields for 1.2km to its exit onto the West Wickham Road just north of Dene Road Cottage (Point E).	<b>Diversion.</b> At Point A, the bridleway will continue along the edge of Borley Wood for a further 180 metres to Point B. It will then turn through 90 degrees and run south-eastwards along an existing farm track to Point C. At the junction of farm tracks, the bridleway will turn and run north-north-east for approximately 900 metres, meeting Public Byway No. 1 (Linton) on the West Wickham parish boundary at Point D.	1
Bridleway No. 28	Begins on the north side of the Horseheath Road (Point F) and heads north-east across an arable field for 400 metres. After crossing over a farm track, turns to an east-north-east alignment and continues for a further 500 metres diagonally across another field to its exit onto the West Wickham Road at Point G.	<b>Extinguishment.</b>	1
New Public Footpath	N/A	<b>Creation of new Public Footpath.</b> Begins on Public Bridleway No. 25, 120 metres north-east of the Horseheath Road, at Point I. Proceeds north-westwards through trees for approximately 500 metres to its exit on to the Balsham Road at Point H.	1
Footpath No. 22	Starts on the Balsham Road near Chilford Hall (Point L) and proceeds north-eastwards across fields for 620 metres, passing close to the edge of Borley Wood, before ending on the Roman road (Public Byway No. 23, Linton) at Point M.	<b>Extinguishment.</b>	1
New Public Bridleway	N/A	<b>Creation of new Public Bridleway.</b> Starts on the Balsham Road opposite the north end of Public Bridleway No. 20 (Point J). Proceeds north-eastwards for 780 metres along field edge parallel to the road, meeting Public Byway No. 23 at Point K.	1
New Public Footpath	N/A	<b>Creation of new Public Footpath.</b> Begins on Public Footpath No. 16 at Point A. Runs east along field edge for 110 metres, finishing on the lane at Point B.	2
Footpath No. 16	Starts on south bank of River Granta, on Public Footpath No. 13, at Point D. Runs south-east and south-west across an arable field for 200 metres, via Point A, to Point E. On opposite side of Cambridge Road (Point F), continues south to its exit on Long Lane (Point G).	<b>Diversion.</b> Starts on south bank of River Granta at Point D. Proceeds eastward along riverbank for 90 metres to Point C, then turns south-west and runs along field edge to Point A. The remainder of the path will remain unchanged.	2

Footpath No. 13	Starts at Linton Mill (Point K) and proceeds south-west across meadow to bank of River Granta (no bridge). Continues on south bank of river at Point D. Bears right along riverbank for 50 metres before turning south-westwards at Point I and running across fields for 225 metres to the Cambridge Road (Point H). Continues south-west on opposite side of road, ending at Long Lane opposite Grip Farm.	<b>Diversion (part) and extinguishment.</b> Starts at Linton Mill (Point K) and proceeds south-west and south to footbridge across River Granta. Continues across footbridge to Point J and then turns west along riverbank and runs for 70 metres to Point I. The cross-field section of Footpath No. 13, running between Points I and H, will be extinguished and walkers wishing to continue to the end of Footpath No. 13 will instead head west and south along Public Footpaths Nos. 15 and 14 for 300 metres, meeting the Cambridge Road at Point D. They can then cross the road and walk the remainder of Footpath No. 13, finishing on Long Lane near Grip Farm.	2
New Public Footpath	N/A	<b>Dedication of existing Permissive Footpath.</b> Starts on newly-diverted route of Public Footpath No. 16 at Point F (see above). Runs east along the south bank of the River Granta for 25 metres to finish by the ford at Point G.	2
Bridleway No. 7	Starts at Little Linton and proceeds southwards along track to Cambridge Road. After crossing road, runs through grain storage facility and then continues along a track across arable fields for 2.3km until it reaches Catley Park. It then follows a meandering southward course through the middle of the farmyard, from Point A to the parish/ county boundary at Point B.	<b>Diversion.</b> Unchanged to Point A. At Point A, the bridleway turns and runs south-eastwards along the north side of the trees for approximately 100 metres, passing through the hedge at Point C. Crosses a farm track and runs south-westwards through trees for 70 metres, then continues along the edge of an arable field for a further 75 metres, meeting the parish/ county boundary at Point B.	3
New Public Footpath	N/A	<b>Dedication of new Public Footpath.</b> Starts on diverted route of Bridleway No. 7 at Point C. Runs south-eastwards between trees along existing farm track. After 100 metres, emerges into fields and continues as a grass track for a further 300 metres to join the Icknield Way at the Bartlow parish boundary (Point G).	3
Footpath No. 29	Starts on Bridleway No. 7 at Point D, approximately 150 metres north of the farm buildings at Catley Park. Proceeds diagonally across field to parish/ county boundary at Point E.	<b>Diversion.</b> Starts on Public Bridleway No. 7 at Point A, continues south-west for approximately 20 metres. At Point F, branches westward and runs along field edge for 170 metres to parish/ county boundary at Point E.	3
Bridleway No. 6	Starts on south side of the Cambridge Road at Point E, near Cow Gallery Wood. Continues along grass track over an arable field for 250 metres, then runs between trees and bushes for a further 370 metres to Point F on the Hildersham parish boundary.	<b>Extinguishment.</b>	4
New Public Bridleway	N/A	<b>Creation of new Public Bridleway.</b> Starts on south side of the Cambridge Road at Point E. Continues north-westwards along field edge, parallel to the road, to Point L on the Hildersham parish boundary.	4

Footpath No. 5	Starts on Public Footpath No. 2 at Point A, just north of Linton Community Sports Centre. Runs diagonally north-westwards across meadows and through disused gravel pit, meeting Public Bridleway No. 7 after 340 metres at Point B. Proceeds westward, where after around 25 metres, the path is obstructed by a building. The footpath then continues on a westward course across an arable field, ending on the Cambridge Road, near Cow Gallery Wood, at Point D	<b>Diversion and extinguishment.</b> From Point A, the path will run south-west and north-west around the southern edge of meadows, and along the north side of the disused gravel pit, ending on Public Bridleway No. 7 at Point C. The remainder of the footpath (Point B to Point D) will be extinguished.	4
New Public Footpath	N/A	<b>Creation of new Public Footpath.</b> Starts on Public Bridleway No. 7 at Point N, on the west side of the lane leading to Little Linton. Proceeds north-west along edge of arable field, parallel to the Cambridge Road, and then north-east alongside Cow Gallery Wood, meeting the re-aligned course of Public Footpath No. 2 (see below) close to Point I.	4
Footpath No. 1	Starts on the Hildersham Road at Point L; proceeds southwards between hedges to end of lane and then continues along a grass track to the footbridge over Mill Lade. Continues through trees and across footbridge over River Granta. After leaving the wooded area, runs south-westwards along edge of field to its junction with Public	<b>Extension and upgrade to public bridleway.</b> Route unchanged to Point H. At Point H, continues south-westwards along field edge for a further 25 metres to Point J, where it joins the realigned and upgraded section of Public Footpath No. 2 (see below)	4
Footpath No. 2	Starts at end of Meadow Lane; proceeds along edge of recreation ground and past the bowling green and play area, with the grounds of the Village College on the lefthand side. Continues along a track across meadows to Little Linton (Point G). After crossing the road leading to Little Linton Farm Barns, proceeds through copse and across two further meadows, meeting Public Footpath No. 1 after approximately 220 metres at Point H. Continues across an arable field, passing under electricity lines, and from Point X, runs along the north edge of Cow Gallery Wood and the sewage works. From the western boundary of the sewage works, runs along the north edge of an arable field for 250 metres to the Hildersham parish boundary.	<b>Diversion and upgrade to bridleway (part).</b> Unchanged to Point G. At Little Linton, will run along an existing farm track past the small copse and along the southern edge of meadows, meeting the newly-extended and upgraded Public Footpath/ Bridleway No. 1 at Point J. Continues along track along the south side of an arable field to the north-east edge of Cow Gallery Wood at point I, where it turns north and skirts along the edge of the wood for 50 metres. At Point X, the footpath continues to the Hildersham parish boundary via the existing route. The section G-J will be upgraded to Public Bridleway status in order to link Public Bridleway No. 7 and the newly-upgraded Public Footpath/ Bridleway No. 1	4
